Why take the MLA exam?

Upon passing the exam you will gain a Level 4 certificate in General Locksmithing Skills, which is the highest locksmithing qualification you can achieve in the UK.

MLA personal members will be awarded QML status once they pass. As MLA Approved Companies must have a QML as a member of staff QML status can really set you apart.

Who should take the exam?

We recommend at least 2 years experience as a locksmith before attempting to take the MLA exam.

The exam is ideal for anyone who is a working locksmith and an MLA registered member. All MLA registered members are required to pass the MLA exam within 4 years of membership.

How can I prepare for the exam?

Our exam preparation day is a great way to learn more about the exam and to practice the skills you'll need to pass. More details can be found on page 6.

What is involved in does the MLA exam?

The exam consists of four timed modules covering fitting, opening, cutting and a written paper; and can be taken with or without coaching.

You can sit one module at a time to make completing a qualification manageable and affordable.

2 Day Exam (with coaching)

The 2 day exam with coaching is designed to help approach the MLA exam fully prepared and with added confidence.

1. WRITTEN PAPER

Time allowed 1 hour 50 short questions of which some may require a sketch.

- The questions will be a broad spectrum of locksmithing, including safes, access control and lever & pin tumbler mechanisms
- The written paper may be undertaken at a regional meeting, at the discretion of the examination board and by prior arrangement with HQ.

2. PRACTICAL - OPEN A BS 5 LEVER MORTICE LOCK

Time allowed 3⁄4 hour

- The lock will be one in common use and can be opened by drilling or manipulation.
- If opened by drilling, then a maximum 7-8mm single hole is allowed and you'll need to identify the lock in order to pass.
- If a 6mm hole is drilled then you can pass without having to identify the lock.
- Marks will be awarded for correct identification together with the level of skill demonstrated.

3. PRACTICAL - FIT A EURO MORTICE DEADLOCK TO A DOOR

Time allowed 1 3/4 hours

You'll be required to fit a euro cylinder operated deadlock with security escutcheons and box striker to a door.

- This is a test of your carpentry skills and lock-fitting jigs will not be allowed.
- Please be aware striker plate must be fully fitted in order to pass. Marks will be awarded according to the level of skill demonstrated.

4. CUT A STEPPED (LEVER) KEY

Time allowed 1 hour

You (the candidate) will be given a customers Union/Chubb detainer range 3G110 and asked to cut a key by hand using your chosen method. The combination of levers must cannot be modified. You'll be given a genuine blank and you may have a second blank issued if required (but no more)

This is a test of bench skills using hand tools only. Not key machines.

- Basic facilities are available, such as vices and blanks but you are to provide the hand tools required to complete the task.
- Key and lever reading type gauges (e.g. depth keys or step gauges) are not allowed although Vernier callipers can be used.
- Your key must be of sufficient standard to operate the lock using your usual method of finishing.
- The lock must work with the original key on completion.
- Your step cuts and spacing must be a faithful reproduction of the manufacturers' original with particular regard to stepped heights, spacing, finish and radius.
